PROGRAM DETAILS



Students are invited to time travel to the everyday lives of people depicted in the genre paintings created by Kim Hong-do (1745-after 1806), one of Korea's most beloved painters. Students will be asked to imagine the stories told in the paintings by comparing and contrasting our modern lives with the lives of people from the late 18th century during the Joseon dynasty (1392-1910). The Museum will provide a post-class worksheet so that students can review the program and play the traditional game *yutnori*.
